

Recycling Tips!



- ✓ Place in your borough provided toter marked for recycling.
- ✓ Pickup occurs at the **same time** as regular trash collection.
- ✓ Leave recyclables **loose** in the bin.
- ✓ **Rinse all residue** from recyclables.
- ✓ Yard waste disposal is a service provided by Advanced Disposal, but **not** in the recycling program. Yard Waste is apart of your regular trash service.
- ✓ Keep recyclables in the bin, **not** on top or placed along the side.
- ✓ Bottle caps **can** remain on your recyclables and are able to be recycled, too.
- ✓ **All** colors of glass can be recycled.



Advance Disposal Pickup:

- ✓ Pickup occurs Monday mornings
- ✓ **One bulk item** is permitted with each pickup. Bulk items include furniture, mattresses, and appliances. Appliances placed for pick-up must have freon removed. Electronics are not accepted for trash pickup.
- ✓ **Please use your borough provided toter!** **Advanced Disposal will not pickup trash that is not in the marked container.**

Not In My Pond – Safe Medication Disposal

Do you know where your unused medication is going?

The Borough Police Department offers safe and private medication disposal. Available to all, the medication box is in the Borough office lobby to offer convenience and confidentiality.

Please do not flush unused medications or throw them away in the trash. Medication that is flushed can contaminate the public water supply and is very difficult to remove. Medications that are disposed of via the trash is deposited at the landfill and can contaminate the soil and ground water.

Additionally, there is a bio-hazard needle disposal located in the lobby. These services are offered to both residents and non-residents.

The lobby is open Mon-Fri, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

From the Manager's Desk...

Trees on Baltimore Ave.

Wondering why the borough is cutting down the trees on N. Baltimore Ave.? The replacement of the trees has been an ongoing project. Years ago, the Borough was told that the Cleveland Pears would be a good fit for the Downtown Streetscape, but sadly that was not the case. They were dirty, the main limbs would split easy, and they began pushing up on the sidewalks. As funding becomes available the borough plans to replace trees with a Japanese Lilac. They are a hearty tree that do not grow high and should enhance our Downtown appearance.

New Park

The Borough has received state and local funding to install a new park next to the Mountain Creek, just behind the old PA Dutch building. This park is planned to have handicap access to the creek and provide a nice setting for residents to enjoy the beautiful Mountain Creek! The project is scheduled to start in late April.

Crosswalk Enhancement

The Borough has secured a grant through the Cumberland County Housing and Redevelopment Authority to fund the engineer plans and construction of ADA (handicap) sidewalks and pedestrian crosswalks. Our goal is to have enough funding to complete two intersections- Butler St. and N. Baltimore Ave. and Church St. and N. Baltimore Ave.

Hill St. Grant

The Borough received a 1.5 million dollar grant from Penn Vest for storm water drainage and road repair. This has been a long road for the residents on Hill Street, and the borough appreciates your patience. Although most of the construction is complete, there are still some areas that the contractors will need to finish in the spring due to weather and other delays. Hill Street extended will need milled and repaved when the weather is permitting of paving. For the most part, all the curbs and sidewalks are completed and only a few driveways still need paved and tied into the existing roadway.

Trine Park

Wondering why the borough was digging at Trine Park? Last year, the borough had a water line rupture that was under the new pavement at the park. This line was installed decades ago and was not installed correctly because the line was just laid in the ground and covered up. There was no stone dust to protect the line so as time went on and the ground settled it put stress on the water line causing it to split. A new water line was installed, and water service was also ran to the pavilions and ball field. Everything is now working great and ready to host your event at the pavilions!

East St. Drainage

The Borough has submitted a grant request to the County Conservation District to cover the cost associated with installing new storm water drainage on East Street. If awarded the grant, most of the \$60,000.00 cost to complete the project will come from the County, and the remaining balance from the Borough's general fund. The goal is to correct the flooding issues by installing several drain boxes along East Street and having it empty into a large cistern that will be constructed under Tichey Park.

E. Pine St. Bridge Replacement

The Borough is working with our Engineering firm, HRG, to submit a multimodal transportation grant to cover the cost of replacement of the bridge that goes over the race water on E. Pine Street. The 104-year-old bridge has surpassed its life expectancy and is in need of replacement. The cost of the project is estimated at \$600,000.00 and would include new curbs and sidewalks leading up to the bridge, guide rails, and pedestrian walkways. We should know by early summer if the Borough is awarded the grant.

Tax Collector Now On-site

The office of the Borough Tax Collector Barbara Boise has changed. She is now located in the borough office at 200 Harman Street. Payments will be collected on Wednesday from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. and Thursday from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Payments can also be mailed or placed in the Borough Office drop box.

Notary Service

The Borough offers FREE notary services to its residents. (Services for non-residents is \$10.00 per notarization.)

Service can be obtained at 200 Harman Street between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

Please bring a current, government-issued identification card that includes an identification or serial number and a photograph, or a physical description, or a signature. All persons signing the document to be notarized must be present.



We cannot offer notary service for car titles, registrations, trailer registrations, or documents for PennDOT.

Water Emergency Notification

Water Bills

Note that to save costs, the Water Authority will no longer send reminder notices for past-due water bills. Pay promptly from your original bill.

Water Meter Replacement Project

For the past two years, the Mount Holly Springs Borough Authority has been replacing old water meters. The replacements are new radio read water meters. The Authority's staff will leave a notice on your front door when they visited to replace your meter. From the Zoning & Codes Office...

The activities of this office contribute directly to protecting and promoting your safety and health and ensuring coordinated and reasonable development within the Borough. Here are a few reminders:

Sidewalk Cleaning

It is illegal to blow leaves or grass onto the street or throw snow into a public roadway. The maintenance department will do its best to remove snow and collect leaves from the roadways. Please do not add to the amount to be collected!



Rental Registry

All rental property owners must supply a current registry of all rental properties and all persons living in properties over the age of 18.

Snow Removal

Residents are reminded to clear the entire sidewalk of snow and ice within 24hrs of the last snow fall.

Leaving snow and ice on sidewalks can result in injury to those using the walkway. Be a good neighbor!



High Grass and Weeds

Owners of a property must maintain any weeds, grass, and other vegetation so it does not exceed six inches.




Permits Needed

If you plan for any of these activities, you'll need a permit: Street Cuts, Peddling, Group Activity, Curb Sidewalk Work, Burning, and Building. You can pick permits up in the Borough Office.

Tree Trimming



It is the property owners responsibility to keep your lawns maintained and trees trimmed. Trees and bushes must not interfere with vehicular or pedestrian traffic, or signage. Trees or bushes that extend into the roadway must be cut to 14 feet clearance. Clearance above sidewalks must be 7 feet, and trees must not block street signs.

Junk Vehicles

Any vehicle without a valid registration or inspection cannot be stored within the Borough limits unless it is stored within an enclosed garage. No car parts or portions of vehicles can be stored outside.
