

Recycling Tips!



- ✓ Place in a bin **clearly** marked for recycling.
- ✓ Pickup occurs at the **same time** as regular trash collection.
- ✓ Leave recyclables **loose** in the bin.
- ✓ **Rinse all residue** from recyclables.
- ✓ Yard waste disposal is a service provided by Advanced Disposal, but **not** in the recycling program. Yard Waste is apart of your regular trash service
- ✓ Keep recyclables in the bin, **not** on top or placed along the side.
- ✓ Bottle caps **can** remain on your recyclables and are able to be recycled, too.
- ✓ **All** colors of glass can be recycled.
- ✓ **When in doubt, throw it out!**

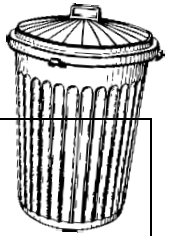

Trash Tags

Cleaning out an attic, garage, or basement? Having a special event? Just have some extra trash? **Just TAG it!** The Borough is now selling tags for residents who have **more than three bags** of trash for their weekly collection. You may purchase as many tags as you need at the Borough Office for \$5.00 each. Simply attach the tag to each extra bag and place curbside for the regular trash pick-up.

Trash Talk



Advance Disposal Pickup:

- ✓ Pickup occurs Monday mornings
- ✓ **Three** containers of trash weighing less than 75 pounds are permitted.
- ✓ **One bulk item** is permitted with each pickup. Bulk items include furniture, mattresses, and appliances. Appliances placed for pick-up must have freon removed. Electronics are not accepted for trash pickup.

Not In My Pond – Safe Medication

The Borough Police Department offers safe and private medication disposal. Available to all, the medication box is in the Borough office lobby to offer convenience and confidentiality.

Please do not flush unused medications or throw them away in the trash. Medication that is flushed can contaminate the public water supply and is very difficult to remove. Medications that are disposed of via the trash is deposited at the landfill and can contaminate the soil and ground water.

The lobby is open Mon-Fri, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Maintenance News:

No Parking Ordinance

This ordinance is enforced the SECOND and FOURTH Tuesday and Thursday of each month from 8:00 a.m. to Noon. For a complete list of streets, visit mhsboro.org. Unsure? Just check the sign on the street where you park. Thanks!

DID YOU KNOW? The Parking Ordinance is not just for street sweeping! We'll use the 8:00 to 12:00 time frame for street cleaning, painting, cleaning drains, weeding, and snow removal. We encourage you to move your cars so those tasks—and more—can be completed.

The Borough is offering an excellent opportunity to stock up on fire wood! We're selling permits for \$25.00 for residents and \$40.00 for non-residents to cut wood at Trine Park for two consecutive days. Proceeds go directly back into the park.

Winter Maintenance

Resident Reminder:

Please move back from the curb anything that over hangs into the roadway. Things such as basketball hoops and mailboxes may be struck during snow plowing.

Brush Chipping

The maintenance department will be offering brush chipping with the following schedule:

Nov. 6th & 7th- Addresses on the West Side of North Baltimore Ave. and North of Pine St.

Nov. 13th & 14th- Address on the East Side of North Baltimore Ave. and North of Pine St.

Nov. 28th- Addresses South of Pine St.

Brush will be picked up curbside where trash is serviced. Please do not bundle the brush.

Leaf Pick-Up

In addition to the trash collectors leaf pick-up, the borough maintenance department will be picking up leaves curbside where trash is picked up.

Residents are asked if leaves are bagged, that the bags are left open. The Borough pick up will occur on Wednesdays and Fridays beginning on October 17th through December 14th. There will be no pick up on Friday November 23rd due to the Thanksgiving holiday.

Christmas Tree Pick-Up

The maintenance department will be picking up Christmas trees following the holiday. Pickups will be on January 2nd, 4th, 9th, and 11th. Please have trees curbside where trash is picked up the night before pickup.

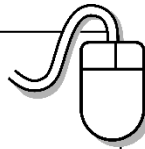

From the Zoning & Codes Office...

The activities of this office contribute directly to protecting and promoting your safety and health and ensuring coordinated and reasonable development within the Borough. Here are a few reminders:

Sidewalk Cleaning

It is illegal to blow leaves or grass onto the street or throw snow into a public roadway. The maintenance department will do its best to remove snow and collect leaves from the roadways. Please do not add to the amount to be collected!



Rental Registry

All rental property owners must supply a current registry of all rental properties and all persons living in properties over the age of 18.

Permits Needed

If you plan for any of these activities, you'll need a permit: Street Cuts, Peddling, Group Activity, Curb Sidewalk Work, Burning, and Building. You can pick permits up in the Borough Office.

We have updated our forms! Some forms can now be filled out and submitted online.

Snow Removal

Residents are reminded to clear the entire sidewalk of snow and ice within 24hrs of the last snow fall.

Leaving snow and ice on sidewalks can result in injury to those using the walkway. Be a good neighbor!



Tree Trimming



It is the property owners responsibility to keep your lawns maintained and trees trimmed. Trees and bushes must not interfere with vehicular or pedestrian traffic, or signage. Trees or bushes that extend into the roadway must be cut to 14 feet clearance. Clearance above sidewalks must be 7 feet, and trees must not block street signs.

High Grass and Weeds

Owners of a property must maintain any weeds, grass, and other vegetation so it does not exceed six inches.



Junk Vehicles

Any vehicle without a valid registration or inspection cannot be stored within the Borough limits unless it is stored within an enclosed garage. No car parts or portions of vehicles can be stored outside.
